OrganizationProfile

Local community-based organizations, institutions, non-profit organizations, and government institutions provide healthcare, education, and social services for the population in the Gaza Strip. Gaza's population of 2 million people is largely considered aid dependent; nearly 80 percent of the population relies on social assistance and nearly 40 percent of those are still living below the poverty line. The Al-Ahli Arab Hospital was established in 1882 by the Church of Mission Society (CMS) of England, later becoming the service ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem in 1982. The community is supportive of this private hospital as it offers quality medical treatment and care including in-patient and out-patient care, preventive medicine, a rehabilitation program for the disabled, and an outreach program that delivers medical care and food for 500 families who have no proper access to health services in their area or are food insecure.

ProjectDescription

With a generous contribution from KHS-Holland in the amount of \$14,501.70, Al-Ahli Arab Hospital purchased Urology Percutaneous Nephrolithotomy (PCNL) equipment. The equipment will allow doctors to perform minimally invasive surgery in the removal of large and complex kidney and ureteral stones, maximizing procedural efficacy and safety, while minimizing patient's blood loss, pain, and recovery time. The equipment has also allowed another source of revenue for the hospital, as this type of procedure is new in the Gaza Strip. In fact, thanks to the generous donation, the hospital has signed agreements with UNRWA, local insurance companies and other international agencies, to accept referrals for this procedure. The hospital estimates that it will be able to conduct procedures with the equipment for an estimated 2,300 patients annually. The revenue from these procedures will also help support the hospital's surgery department, with the procurement of medical supplies or cover the costs of salaries for doctors and nurses, thus reducing reliance on overall donor funding for operating costs.
